Make a Bottle Filter – You can make muddy water run clear. It does not kill bacteria so **DO NOT DRINK IT.**



- 2. Put a piece of cloth in the neck of the bottle.
- 3. Add a layer of charcoal or sand.
- 4. Add a layer of gravel.
- 5. Add a layer of grass and leaves.
- 6. Add a layer of wood shavings.
- 7. Make sure everything is compacted down.
- 8. Pour your muddy water through the bottle filter into another container.
- 9. Pass it through the filter several times until it runs clear.






