7. How are the teachers in school helped to work with children with SEND, and what training do the teachers have?

The SENDCo's job is to support class teachers in planning for children with SEND.

- The school provides training and support to enable all staff to improve the teaching and learning of children, including those with SEN. This includes whole school training on SEN issues, such as Anger Management; Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Dyslexia and speech and language difficulties.
- All school staff have received 'STEP's training' to help children cope with their emotions, understanding that all behavior is a form of communication. At times of high anxiety, children need to be supported to express their needs in pro-social ways within a safe environment, thus learning skills which will support them throughout their lives.
- Individual teachers and support staff attend training courses run by outside agencies that are relevant to the needs of specific children in their class, e.g. from SEND services.
- Medical training to support pupils with medical care plans such as diabetes and epipen training.
