They were sent away from London during the Second World War, to the house of a kind old Professor who lived in the country. On the first morning the children decided to explore the big house. It was full of interesting things and unexpected places. One room had a suit of armour in it. Another, all hung with green, had a harp in the corner. And one room was quite empty except for a big wardrobe with a looking-glass in the door. "Nothing there," said Peter, and they all trooped out again – all except Lucy. Read p1 of the picture book up to 'all except Lucy' Imagine that you are staying at the professor's house and that you are one of the children from the story. You have just arrived and want to explore because you are curious and excited. Head around the house, entering different rooms, looking in awe and wonder.
