Activity one	<p>Moving and Handling- Use your playdough from Friday to have a go at exercising your finger muscles through 'Dough disco' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=i-lfzeG1aC4 This is really good for your fine motor skills and helps to support writing skills.</p> <p>Choose one other fine motor activities to practise out of the following options: Practise zipping up yours and other people's coats in your house every time someone puts their coat on. Make your own indoor washing line and peg small items of clothing on it. Find an item of clothing that has buttons and have a go at doing them up and undoing them.</p>	<p>Mathematics- Have a look at the Capacity powerpoint to learn about vocabulary to describe how much a container holds, usually a liquid. Have a go at answering the questions? This powerpoint has audio clips attached (click on the top left) or you can read the text.</p> <p>Once you have had a look at the powerpoint, you can choose to do one of the following, or you may choose to have a go at both: Practical- Ordering cups OR Capacity sorting worksheet</p>	<p>PE- Have a go at the 'Power Up' session with GoNoodle. Join in with as much as can! https://family.gonoodle.com/activities/power-up</p>	<p>Mathematics- Watch the video introducing 9- https://vimeo.com/506509103 Things to think about: Where might we find 9? Where does 9 come on our number line? What would 9 o'clock look like? How can we make 9p? Is 9 an odd number or an even number? How do you know?</p> <p>Children to complete challenges for 9 to demonstrate their understanding. These can be photographed or recorded to share with us via Tapestry.</p> <p>Complete the adventures of number 9 worksheet.</p>	<p>Phonics- Watch the video introducing the new digraph 'ur'. https://vimeo.com/506466666 Children to practice writing the new digraph, focus on accurate formation. Have a go at writing a word containing the new sound: Turn, curd, hurl, curl. Encourage children to use their chopping hands. Attempt to write this sentence 'I had a turn'</p> <p>Play a game of 'Phonics pop' can you find and pop all the bubbles containing the correct digraph? This is good for digraph recognition. https://www.ictgames.com/phonicsPop/index.html</p>
Activity two	<p>Literacy- Phonics- Watch the video introducing the new digraph 'ow'. https://vimeo.com/506464206 Children to practice writing the new digraph, focus on accurate formation. Have a go at writing a word containing the new sound: Cow, now, town, bow, down. Encourage children to use their chopping hands. Attempt to write this sentence 'The cow was in town'.</p> <p>Have a go at 'Pick a picture'. Select Phase 3 sets 6-7 for the moment until we have taught all phase 3 sounds. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/2/pick-a-picture</p>	<p>Phonics- Watch the video introducing the new digraph 'ar'. https://vimeo.com/506461731 Children to practice writing the new digraph, focus on accurate formation. Have a go at writing a word containing the new sound: Car, far, park, star, mark. Encourage children to use their chopping hands. Attempt to write this sentence 'The park is fun'.</p> <p>Play a game on Phonicsplay- https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources Use 'Buried Treasure', 'Dragon's Den' or 'Picnic on Pluto'- Select Phase 3 and chose the sound we have learnt today. Remember to use your chopping hands to help you segment the words.</p>	<p>Expressive art and design/ Understanding the World Video- https://vimeo.com/506508661 Use the pictures to discuss different materials that toys are made of. Why were these materials used? What are the best materials to use? Why are they good materials to use? Can you make a toy at home, this could be using construction toys such as Lego, K'nex etc. or junk modelling. Take a photo of it and explain why you have made it in the way you have.</p>	<p>Phonics- Watch the video introducing the new digraph 'oi'. https://vimeo.com/506462942 Children to practice writing the new digraph, focus on accurate formation. Have a go at writing a word containing the new sound: Coin, soil, foil, oil, coil. Encourage children to use their chopping hands. Attempt to write this sentence 'The soil is brown'</p> <p>Have a go at 'Blending Bingo'- you will need to print your bingo card off before playing this game https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/bingoOriginal/index.html Select phase 3 sounds we have already covered. Remember to use your chopping hands to help you segment the words. Colour in the star on your bingo card when it appears.</p>	<p>Mathematics- Watch Numberblocks 9 https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08p-hbzc/numberblocks-series-2-nine</p> <p>Then have a go at finding different ways to make 9 using the part-part whole model, discussed in yesterday's maths video. Remember to use physical objects to support using the part-part whole model, before recording. You may want to record using dots or numerals.</p>

Why are they your favourite? Are they the same or different to the toys your friends like to play with?</p> <p>Children to take a photo/ draw a picture of their favourite toy and write one sentence about why it is their favourite.</p>	<p>Tech/ PSED- Watch the video about internet safety with Buddy the dog. https://vimeo.com/506504535 Stop during the story and discuss what you would do in these scenarios.</p> <p>Create a poster about how to stay safe when using a tablet, smartphone or the internet. We look forward to seeing these on Tapestry. You may want to put your poster in a window where other people might see it as they walk past your house.</p>	<p>Literacy- Phonics- Watch the video introducing the recapping phase 2 tricky words and then introduce new tricky word- 'you'. https://vimeo.com/506465616</p> <p>Children to look through the text and spot the new tricky word, draw a circle around it. Read the text with the children encouraging them to segment and blend some of the words, focus on them reading the new tricky word.</p> <p>Can you spot this new word in any of your reading books? Can you think of a sentence you could write using the new tricky word?</p>	<p>PE- Have a go at Kidz Bop Dance Along. Choose your favourite song and dance to the beat. See if you can follow the people on your screen.
