<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English Tasks</u></p> <p>We have now finished our Roman text, the Horde of Ravens. This week we would like you to have a go at the 2014 comprehension SATs paper. These will be sent as a PDFs.</p> <p>These can be printed off, which is a fair amount of paper, or to save paper, children can simply look at the questions on the screen and write the answers down. This may require flicking between two tabs on one screen (from reading booklet to answer booklet). We appreciate that this is not ideal, so if two screens are available this may be preferable. If this ends up being too challenging, please do let us know.</p> <p>These papers are based on the old levels system (levels 3-6) rather than Working Towards, At and Greater Depth; however they are still full of excellent and applicable questions for Year 5/6. Year 5s, there is a lot in these papers that you will be able to have a go at (level 3 and 4 knowledge questions have been taught in year 5). Year 5's, you have not been taught what is on the level 6 paper; please do not worry if you don't want to give this a go!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">A reminder – level 6 papers are hard! They are year 6 greater depth type questions, so please don't worry if you find these rather challenging or would prefer not to give these a go!</p>

Reading

At least 20 minutes reading each day. This might be reading or being read to.

Maths

Some children will find that what is set is plenty to do, others may find they complete tasks very quickly. If this is the case there are a couple of options. 1) Based on the activities set, create your own more challenging questions! Then solve! See what challenges you can set yourself! 2) Use other suggested resources (BBC bitesize etc) to 'top up' your activities.

A bit different this week; no 30430 and no Purple Mash 2dos

Rather it will be the 2014 SATS paper (**Questions and answers will be sent as a PDF**)

These can be printed off, which is a fair amount of paper, or to save paper, children can simply look at the questions on the screen and write the answers down. If the question requires drawing something on the answer booklet, these questions may need printing (if this is an real issue for you, don't worry, just do the best you can 😊). Top tip, if you are printing the whole booklet, save paper by not printing title papers and blank pages at the front and back of the booklet. Also, if you are missing any needed equipment, such as a protractor, don't worry, simply miss out that question. Just to reiterate, it doesn't matter if you can't print any of this out – just look at questions on a screen and do what you can!

These papers are based on the old levels system (levels 3-6) rather than Working Towards, At and Greater Depth; however they are still full of excellent and applicable questions for Year 5/6. Year 5s, there is a lot in these papers that you will be able to have a go at (level 3 and 4 knowledge questions have been taught in year 5). 1) We would like everyone to have a go at the mental maths test (this is instead of your 30430). The transcript is **sent a as PDF**, so an adult can read the questions to the child, or if this is not possible, you can go on the website below and click on the 2014 mental maths Audio MP3. This website also has the grade thresholds if this is something you are interested in.
